1. Add Category Clues to Tailor Your Search

Type your transcription guess + the English or German word below:

- a. occupation or Beruf
- b. illness or Krankheit
- c. first name or Vorname
- d. last name or Nachname
- e. abbreviation or Abkürzung
- f. currency or Währung
- g. unit of measurement or Maßnahme
- h. military or *Militär*
- i. meaning or Bedeutung
- j. genealogy or Ahnenforschung

2. Translate Websites to See Them in English

- a. With Chrome: Right-click > Translate to English
- b. Otherwise: Copy and paste link via Google Translate

3. Use Quotes to Search the Remainder of a Phrase

- a. Bible verses or hymns
- b. Legal or standard forms
- c. Songs
- d. Poems
- e. Commonly-used phrases



4. Use Wildcard Feature to Fill in the Blank

- a. Use quotes with asterisk * for missing word
- b. Can use asterisk more than once in same phrase
- c. Use for common phrases

5. Use Google Maps to Decipher Town Names

- a. Search the town where your document comes from
- b. Browse towns nearby to see possible names
- c. Extra Hint: You can also use the map on www.meyersgaz.org for this trick.
