

# **Kingdom of Hungary Gazetteer: 1913**

Hungary "How to" Guide, Intermediate Level: Instruction

July 2022

#### **GOAL**

This guide will teach you how to use and access the 1913 gazetteer for the Kingdom of Hungary.

## INTRODUCTION

The 1913 gazetteer, officially *A Magyar Szent Korona Országainak Helységnévtára* (List of Locations of the Countries of the Hungarian Holy Crown), provides county jurisdictions and spellings used in the Kingdom of Hungary based on information gathered from the 1910 census. This gazetteer includes locations within modern Hungary as well as *parts* of modern Austria, Croatia, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Ukraine.

Not only does this gazetteer include information about religious jurisdictions, such as where the nearest parish or synagogue is located, but also civil jurisdictions including the location of the nearest civil registration office. Civil registration for areas in volumes 1 and 2 began on October 1, 1895. Civil registration information is *not* included for locations in volume 3 as civil registration for those locations started later.

Before proceeding you will need to know the name of the town where your ancestors lived and their religion.

#### **HOW TO**

To access the 1913 gazetteer online, go to the FamilySearch Digital Library (https://www.familysearch.org/library/books/). All three volumes are available under the following titles:

Volumes 1 and 2 cover the Kingdom of Hungary (dark green area #16). Volume 3 covers the Kingdom of Croatia-Slavonia (maroon area #17) which now includes parts of modern Croatia and Slovenia. Note that volume 1 includes quite a bit of front matter so the alphabetical list of places does not start until you are more than one-third of the way into the book.
