also known as dissenters

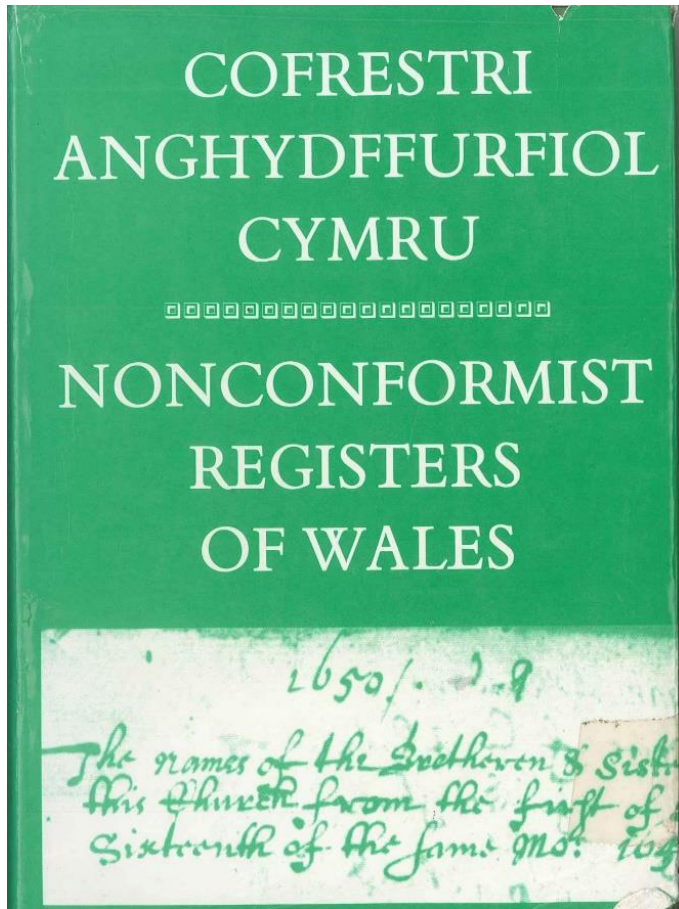
Hardwicke's Marriage Act 1754

All marriages between 1754 and 1837, except for those of Jews and Quakers had to take place within the established church.

Pre-1837 nonconformist registers

- Civil Registration Act of 1836 Registrar General collected nonconformist registers of England and Wales

- A chapel had to apply for a licence in order to hold a marriage in the chapel
- Not all chapels had their own graveyards – if not members buried in the parish church

A new period began in the history of the Welsh periodical press when *Trysorfa ysprydol* [The Spiritual treasury] was published in 1799, edited by Thomas Charles of Bala and Thomas Jones of Denbigh.

Trysorfa Ysprydol

Trysorfa was a product of the 18th century religious revival, and was in fact the first religious and denominational magazine to be published in Welsh.

Itinerant preachers, Sunday school teachers and pupils required reading material and *Trysorfa ysprydol* was a means of supplying them with knowledge. But all these Welsh periodicals dating from the end of the 18th century and the first decade of the 19th were comparatively short-lived. Difficulties of distribution and sale, together with the prohibitive price of paper, made publication a considerable risk for editor and publisher alike.

Yr Eurgrawn Wesleyaidd

Yr Eurgrawn Wesleyaidd [The Wesleyan magazine], established in 1809, was therefore hardly expected to succeed. Surprisingly however, it appeared monthly from 1809 to 1962, when it became a quarterly, and continued to be published as such from 1962 to 1983.

Seren Gomer

The other religious denominations soon realised the need for periodicals and journals to spread their message. *Seren Gomer* [The Star of Gomer] was established as a weekly newspaper on 1 January 1814, and appeared until August 1815, when it ended through lack of support. Four years later however in 1818 it was revived again as *Seren Gomer* a fortnightly magazine, and became known as a Baptist publication, though it had no official connection with the denomination until 1880.

MINING—WILLIAMS V. SPARROW AND POOLE.
This was an action brought by a boy for 16s. 6d. damages said to be due to him from Messrs. Sparrow and Poole. Mr Acton appeared for the defence. From the evidence it appeared that the boy had left his employment without notice, averring as a reason that there was no fair in the pit. This allegation was disproved by competent witnesses, and judgment given for the defendants.


A SOOTY SUIT—JONES V. WHITTAKER.
This was an action brought by Charles Jones, chimney-sweeper, against Mr Whittaker, of the Lion Hotel, for the recovery of 2s. 6d. for sweeping three chimnies. The defendant said plaintiff carried the soot away after sweeping the chimnies, in consequence of which he offered him 1s. 6d. for his work. Plaintiff said this was the practice of the trade. Defendant said it was not, especially when those who employed the sweep had a garage. His Honour concurred, and gave judgment for the defendant.

LOADING THE WRONG HORSE—EDWARDS V. BRYNYR-OWEN COAL COMPANY.
This was an action brought by a youth named John Edwards, against the Brynyrowen Coal Company, for the recovery of £1 19s. 6d., in lieu of a fortnight's notice. Sherratt appeared for the plaintiff and Mr Wyatt for the defendant. It appeared that the

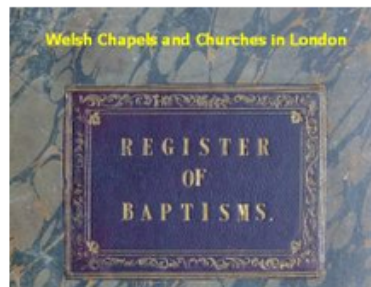

JEWIN WELSH CHAPEL (CALVINISTIC METHODIST)

The first Welsh chapel in London was built at Wilderness Row, east of Clerkenwell Green, EC1, moving in 1828 to Jewin Crescent. Rebuilt following wartime bombing at Fann Street (EC1Y 0SA), the chapel is now known as Jewin Welsh Church.
